

Maths

Children will work on fractions before moving onto position and direction, time and money this term. We will then undertake some end of year assessments and use the final weeks to address any areas that need consolidating.

Design and Technology

Children will carry out research on sandwiches, ready to design, evaluate, improve and make a sandwich fit for a royal banquet, which they will enjoy at the end of the unit!

PE

After more Sports Day preparations and Sports Day itself in week 1, the two units will then be Yoga and Net and Wall.

English

Children will explore a variety of texts to support in building an understanding of narrative for creative writing. Texts chosen will contain lots of new topic vocabulary and settings based on kings, queens, castles and palaces. Children will sequence sentences to form short narratives, inspired by stories they have explored. They will understand that stories have a beginning, middle and end and ensure their own stories contain all three. Children will become familiar with pre-fixes and suffixes and begin to use these with growing confidence.

Computing

The children will be introduced to on-screen programming through Scratch Jr. They will explore the way a project looks by investigating sprites and backgrounds. They will use programming blocks to use, modify, and create programs. They will also be introduced to the early stages of program design through the introduction of algorithms.

RE - Islam

The children will learn about the five pillars of Islam.

Music

Mr Grimes will teach the children songs which they will perform in a Summer Concert at the end of the term!

Enrichment – Tower of London and Ladywell Fields

Our trip to the Tower of London is to see how the tower itself is a source of history. Ladywell Fields will be visited for the final time this year to discuss what seasonal changes we can now see. This will be captured using observational drawings.

History

The children will learn about why our local area is called Honor Oak Park and gain historical knowledge of the 3 Queens that have ruled England. They will then focus on looking at the similarities and differences of QEII and King Charles III coronations and compare them.

Science

Children will learn to identify and compare the suitability of a variety of everyday materials, including wood, metal, plastic, glass, brick, rock, paper and cardboard for particular uses.
