You could play board games and roll the dice twice.</p>  <p>You could find some facts about different sizes of minibeasts.</p> 
<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Phonics</u></b></p> <p>We will practise reading tricky words.</p> <p>Graphemes learnt so far: s, a, t, p, i, n, m, d, g, o, c, k, ck, e, u, r, ll, ff, j, ss, v, w, x, y, z, qu, ch, sh, th, ng, nk, ai, ee, igh, oa, oo, oo, ar, or, ur, ow, oi, ear, air, er,</p> <p>Tricky words taught so far: is, I, the, pull, full, as, and, has, his, her, go, no, to, into, she, he, push, of, was, you, they, sure, pure, put, my, by, all, said, so, have, like, come, some, love, do, were, here, little, says, there, when, what, one, today, out.</p>	<p>Try to spot tricky words in books or magazines that you are reading. Can your child spell them out, for example, with magnetic letters?</p>
