


Queen Elizabeth II

# Computing – Follow my design

The children will use their project designs from last week to create their projects on-screen in ScratchJr.

They will use their project design, including algorithms created in the previous lesson, to make programs for each of their rocket sprites. They will test whether their algorithms are effective when their programs are run.
