Next Week in Reception Week Beginning 18th November 2024

What we will be doing in school

We will read the books 'Peace at Last' and 'Whatever Next'.



We will talk about fireworks and we will think about some of the sounds the children may have heard recently. We will then write some rhyming words using some of these words.

If you saw and heard any fireworks last week, ask your child to describe the sounds that they hear, for example, whizz or bang.

Can they think of any words that sound like or rhyme with another word? For example, fizz and whizz.

Maths

We will be exploring length and weight this week, learning vocabulary such as heavier and lighter, shorter and taller and longer and shorter to compare items. We will be using scales to measure as well as investigating the weights of different objects to order them.



Help your child practise ordering objects by length, height or weight around the house, for example, which is their longest toy? How do they know? How long can they build a train track?



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Phonics

New phonemes: z, zz, qu, ch

New words: Words with s at the end, e.g.

hats

New tricky words: go, no, to, into

<u>Sounds learnt so far</u>: s, a, t, p, i, n, m, d, g, o, c, k, ck, e, u, r, II, ff, j, ss, v, w, x, y

<u>Tricky words taught so far:</u> is, I, the, pull, full, put, as, and, has, his, her

Write simple words on pieces of paper. Hide them around the room. Challenge your child to find the words and help them to read them. Can they write some words for you to find and read?

Look for tricky words on signs and posters when you are out with your child. How many can your child spot?
