Spellings

Starting from next week, the children will be having a spelling quiz on Fridays.

We will let you know the words that will be in the quiz each week so that they can be practised at home. The words in each quiz are selected as they are either frequently used and incorrectly spelt words, common exception words and/or words that we will most likely use in our writing next week.

This week's spelling quiz words:

Could, saw, busy, house, window

When practising at home, start off by letting your child see the word and copy it up. Then see your child can cover the word up and spell it correctly from memory. Keep practising till they are confident and accurate. Make practising these words memorable by writing with and on different materials, or against the clock. Get the stopwatch up on your phone, how many times can they write one of the words in a minute? Can they write the chosen word more times in a minute than you can?

If the quiz highlights there is still a word or two your child is finding problematic, we will support them with learning and memorising them during what is left of the week.


Watch this video to learn about Hinduism! This will support the children in their discussions this week

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Science: This half term the children will be building on their knowledge of UK weather. They will be carrying out weather data collection and comparing our climate to that of other parts of the world.

To start the unit, the children will be recapping the knowledge they learnt in Year 1 about the four seasons in the UK. After sorting seasonal facts they will learn about how not every part of the world has four seasons like us.



As you're out and about, quiz your child on what season it is? Are there any clues around us? The falling leaves perhaps?

Computing

Next term the children will be taking and editing their own photographs, learning about how to take a well composed photograph and use digital tools to make it even better. We'll also look at how you can spot altered photographs.
