What we will be doing in school

How you can help at home

Topic - On the Move

This week we will learn about trains and railways. We will read the books Oi Get of my Train, The Train Ride and information books about trains.

We will learn about some of the ways people travelled before trains were invented.

We will begin to learn about the history of trains.

Visit a different train station. Have the children been on a train journey? Perhaps you travelled somewhere by train during the Christmas holidays.

Why not visit the London Transport Museum or perhaps you may wish to take your child on a train journey!



Maths

We will continue to explore how to make numbers. We will focus on five and six.



Try some practical games. You could create a ramp from household objects or help your child to measure how far they can jump forward. On your way to and from school, ask your child to compare the length of different things using e.g. steps, for example how many steps does it take to get from one end of the car to the other compared to a truck! Which one is longer, how do you know?

Phonics

New digraphs: ur, ow, oi, ear

When reading books, can you spot the sounds of the week in the story? If you're reading to your child and spot a word containing these sounds can they read the word for you? Can they spot them in the books they read themselves?

Write some words containing these sounds on pieces of paper – can they sort them by their sound e.g. all ur words together. This will encourage them to spot the digraphs/trigraphs independently in reading!

Pronunciation Phrase - ur Open your mouth in a relaxed way, push your tongue down and say ur ur ur

Pronunciation Phrase - oi Make an 'o' with your mouth then move your lips out as you say oi oi oi



ow

Pronunciation Phrase - ow Open your mouth wide then move your lips together as you say ow ow ow



ear

Pronunciation Phrase - ear Smile with your lips apart, push your tongue to your teeth as you say ear ear ear

New Tricky Words: my, by, all

Graphemes learnt so far: s, a, t, p, i, n, m, d, g, o, c, k, ck, e, u, r, II, ff, j, ss, v, w, x, y, z, qu, ch, sh, th, ng, nk, ai, ee, igh, oa, oo, oo, ar, or

<u>Tricky words taught so far:</u> is, I, the, pull, full, put, as, and, has, his, her, go, no, to, into, she, he, push, of, we, me, be, was, you, they

We will be reading and writing words. Can you spot segment and blend these words and spot this week's phonemes?

We will be reading sentences. Can you spot any tricky words? Can you segment and blend the words and look out for this week's phonemes?
