Our Tricky Words will be:


We'll recap all the tricky words we've learnt so far this term:

Maths

This week we will be moving into doubling. We will revisit what it means to double and what happens to numbers when we double. We will be doing this in a multitude of ways. First using objects, then pictorial representations, followed by writing number sentences.

Help your child at home with their digit formation especially some of the teen numbers, checking for example that they write 13 not 31.



<u>Science – Seasonal Weather</u>

This week we will return to our weather data charts and begin to look at seasonal changes. As a class, we will record the weather we are experiencing in Winter looking at the temperature, as well as discussing day length and how this is beginning to change.

Don't forget to keep that re-call going of animals! Continue to look at animal classes and their features knowledge with this fun game!
